

RMHA moorings for visitors.

Visitors are welcome at Paglesham and are encouraged to use the mooring buoys downstream from the slipway. These moorings are maintained by the Roach Mooring Holders Association on an annual basis.

It is only a small walk up to the Plough and Sail pub but note they do not open Mondays and you are advised to book ahead. Paglesham is a beautiful natural setting so just a stay overnight on a mooring is very peaceful and relaxing.

Available buoys are downstream of the boatyard pontoon. You are advised to use your own strops.

So long as the mooring has no boat or dinghy attached, it can be used. Moorings upstream of the boatyard pontoon are private. Please note that no stay must be longer than two nights and only one boat per mooring. Only boats under 12 ton and under 46 feet may use the moorings.

Boats must have marine 3rd party insurance.

The yard at Paglesham has no shore based facilities for visiting yachtsman as it is now a commercial yard building residential barges. Visitors are advised they should not use the jetty/pontoon but land on the slipway and carry a dinghy up the slipway. Wear wellington boots as the slipway has a lot of mud and old oyster shells!

Alternatively there is a walkway to low water a short distance into Paglesham pool on the west side.

The charge for an overnight stay is on a trust basis and £15 per night. Please pay by transfer to the Roach Mooring Holders Association (RMHA) as follows
